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Mohs Surgery for Thin Melanomas: Providing High Functional and Aesthetic Outcomes

Technical advances now allow Mohs micrographic surgery to be used as a crucial tool in the treatment of melanoma.

he incidence of melanoma has surpassed that of any other malignancy over the last four decades, and it continues to increase annually. The medical community has endeavored to keep pace with the disease, but despite our advances, a significant impact on mortality in advanced stages eludes us.

Surgical management of melanoma has evolved in parallel with our increased understanding of the events that propagate and sustain the malignant cascade. Less than half a century ago, radical amputation with en bloc resection of nodal basins was considered the standard of care for all melanoma, regardless of size or depth. No survival benefit was gained from such large resections, and margins for excision have progressively diminished over the last few decades as large, randomized trials have consistently shown no statistical advantage to wide-margin excision over narrower margins. Our collective experience and trials have demonstrated the most dramatic effect on melanoma outcome is achieved by early diagnosis and complete, margin-free extirpation of the primary tumor.


Mohs surgery has been used to treat melanoma since the technique itself was pioneered by Frederick Mohs in the 1940s and has resulted in some of the highest reported cure rates amongst treatment modalities. This is in part due to techniques that allow for examination of the entirety of the surgical margin. Traditional vertical section histopathology examines less than 0.1% of the entire margin which results in a 58% probability of finding tumor, if present, at a surgical margin¹. Mohs micrographic surgery, in contrast, visualizes 100% of the surgical margin with each procedure.

The addition of a new surgeon with specialty training under Drs. John Zitelli and David Brodland, leaders in the field of Mohs surgery for the treatment of melanocytic tumors, allows Dermatology Associates to offer this service to patients beginning in July.

The technique takes advantage of recent advances in the field of frozen-section pathology, allowing precise staining and identification of abnormal cells through a process known as immunohistochemistry. Recurrence rates are among the lowest reported for surgical modalities: as low as 0–0.5% for surgeons specially trained in the technique^{2,3,4,5}.

The importance of complete local tumor clearance cannot be overstated. Tumor persisting after failure of traditional margin-based excision has been shown to

result in further tumor progression. Persistent melanoma in situ recurs as invasive melanoma 22.6% of the time, with an average Breslow depth of 0.94 mm⁶. The resultant upstaging of melanoma and potential further workup and treatment—sentinel node biopsy, nodal dissection, adjuvant chemotherapy, etc.—may have been prevented with complete excision at first treatment.

Technical advances now allow Mohs micrographic surgery to be used as a crucial tool to visualize the microscopic extension of ill-defined tumors. It is particularly helpful for lentigo maligna/melanoma in situ, tumors that occur on a background of sun-damaged skin and have variable subclinical extension. The technique is only practiced in specialized centers by surgeons certified by the American College of Mohs Surgeons after an intensive additional year of training. It allows for real time extirpation of malignant melanocytic lesions with superb local clearance rates. The Mohs technique minimizes excess margins of normal skin that must be sacrificed in order to achieve excellent rates of local cure and provides the highest functional and aesthetic outcomes.
