

PERK UP YOUR SKIN WITH A PEEL!

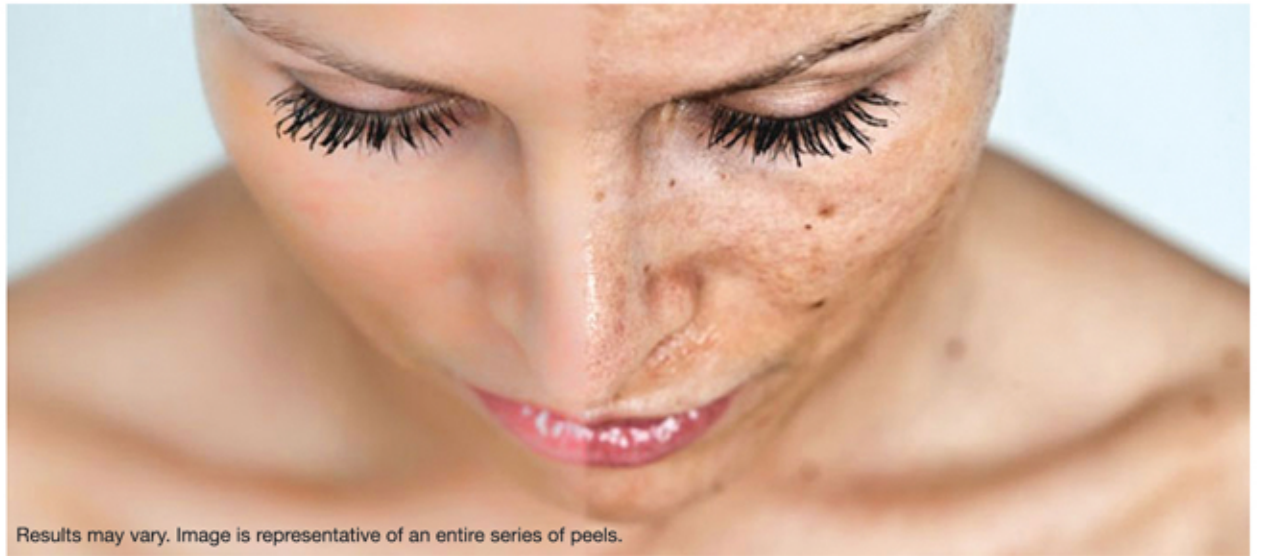
